1 Introduction

Bryanston is a co-educational independent boarding school welcoming pupils from the ages of 3 to 18. The prep school, Bryanston Prep, is for pupils aged 3-13 (Nursery to Year 8), with the senior school, Bryanston, being for children aged 13-18 (Year 9 – Year 13). Subject to places being available, children are accepted for entry into any year group.

The aim of our admissions procedure is to ensure that pupils who join Bryanston are able to thrive academically, socially and culturally within our academic, co-curricular and pastoral systems.

Bryanston is an academically selective school, but we endeavour to admit pupils with a broad range of talents who will benefit from the curricular and co-curricular opportunities available at the school and who are prepared to contribute enthusiastically to the school community. We value art, drama, music, outward-bound, sport and service, and look for pupils with a readiness to live as a boarder within our school community and make the most of all that is on offer at Bryanston. We aim to admit a diverse group of pupils each year and extra-curricular contributions and character are considered as carefully as academic ability.

2 Equal Opportunities

Bryanston is committed to equal treatment for all applicants regardless of race, disability, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation or background who are comfortable with the Christian ethos of the school.

We welcome applications from pupils with special educational needs or disabilities provided that our Learning Support department can provide any additional support required. We strongly advise parents of children with special educational needs or physical or cognitive disabilities to discuss their child's requirements with us before commencing the registration process. Parents should provide a copy of an educational psychologist's report or medical report if they have one to enable us to assess the level of support needed before they embark on the admissions process. Before an offer is made, the school will assess whether it is able to adequately cater for and meet any the pupil's SEN or disabilities (if known) through discussion and meeting with parents, consideration of any specialist reports and school references, and assessment of the pupil during the admissions process, as appropriate.

We seek to manage our admissions procedures fairly and sensitively. We value family connections with the school and welcome new associations and links. Where there are more applicants than places, the following are considered in the Head's decision of an offer of a place:



- i the pupil's commitment to the school
- ii anticipated benefit for the applicant in coming to the school
- iii likely level of involvement in and contribution to the life of the school
- iv the reference from the previous school
- v the proposed academic programme
- vi connections with the school (siblings in particular)

3 Expectations

The following information is available for prospective parents when they enquire about admission and register their child's name for entry. This information can be found on the school website or the school will provide other means of access.

Pupils and their parents are expected to work with us for the good of the school community. They should understand our rules and expectations of behaviour and be prepared to support the school in order to achieve them.

Application and Admissions Procedures

Bryanston Prep - 3-13yrs

Children join Bryanston Prep in our Early Years setting but can be in any year if spaces are available. In year admission is also possible if space is available. We welcome overseas applicant who may wish to join for a minimum of one term or longer.

Visiting the School

A visit to Bryanston Prep is an important part of the admissions process and this can either be by arranging a personal tour or attending one of our Open Mornings. For their first visit



to the School, parents usually meet the Head, a member of the Admissions team and have a tour of the School.

Registration

A child may be registered for admission at any time after birth. A non-refundable registration fee of £100 is charged and we request a copy of the child's most recent school report, SEN reports or any documents which support their application. On receipt the child's name is added to the Registration List, but registration does not in itself guarantee a place at the School.

Assessment

Prospective pupils will be invited to attend a taster day and/or overnight session. This enables them to experience Bryanston Prep for themselves, whilst allowing us to conduct an informal assessment to ensure that we are the right school for them as an individual, both academically and pastorally.

For children wishing to join Year 6 – 8 a CAT4 will also be taken, and if required an online English as an Additional Learning test using Password.

Bursary

Means- tested bursaries and scholarships in Year 5 are available. Further details can be found on our website.

Place offer and acceptance

Once a pupil has been assessed, a formal offer of a place will be made, at which point parents will be asked to complete an acceptance form and pay a non-refundable £350 deposit to secure the offered place.

International Applicants

Bryanston Prep has a limited number of places each year for pupils for whom English is not their first language. To ensure that they can fully integrate and gain maximum benefit from their time at the school, pupils with English as an additional language (EAL) joining Bryanston Prep should have a working level of English that allows them to manage in our academic environment and to communicate with their peers. This will be assessed through a written assessment and informal conversation with a member of staff.

Bryanston School - 13+

Visiting the School

Most prospective parents arrange to visit the School at least three years before the pupil is due to join. For the first visit to the School, parents usually attend a small group visit where they meet the Head or a member of SLT, Head of Admissions, Teaching staff and a Houseparent and have a tour of the School with a pupil. It is also possible to arrange an individual visit for members of the family to meet the Head, Head of Admissions, a member of the Teaching staff and have a tour of the school with a pupil.



Registration

A child may be registered for admission at any time after birth. A non-refundable registration fee of £250 is charged and on receipt the child's name is added to the Registration List, but registration does not in itself guarantee a place at the School. We accept registrations for a place any time during the year of Entrance Assessment (either Y6, Y7 or Y8). Once registered, we communicate regularly with parents and with the child's current school to ensure that Bryanston is able to offer an educational environment in which each child can thrive.

Selection

Admission is dependent upon a candidate providing a satisfactory performance when sitting GL Assessments CAT4 in the Autumn Term of the year of Entrance Assessment (either Y6, Y7 or Y8). Additionally, a satisfactory reference from their current school will be sought and this will form an important element of the overview of each child.

Every candidate is interviewed by the Head or an Admissions Tutor at the Interview Assessment Day during the following early January when we look for effort, potential and willingness to engage in busy boarding life. We can offer further advice and assessment for borderline candidates if there are further opportunities, and an application is early enough to allow for this.

Firm Offers will be made either in Y6, Y7 or Y8 for entry to Bryanston in Y9, assuming a candidate has passed all elements of the admissions process and a request for the full non-refundable deposit of £2000 will be made in order to formally secure the place.

International Applicants

As a general rule, we look for CEFR B1 or 2 as a minimum entry level. All international applicants will sit the CAT4 Assessments alongside sitting a CEFR test using the Password online testing platform and have an interview.

Bryanston School - 16+

General Information

Bryanston's aim is to admit pupils at this point of entry who will integrate happily and successfully into the existing community, enhance the Sixth Form and make full use of the opportunities the School offers.

Entry Requirements

For pupils entering the Sixth Form currently studying GCSEs, entry requirements are 40 points at GCSE. The GCSE grades 9 – 1 will be counted at face value. For further information please contact the Admissions Office.

Candidates who have studied for the IBMYP should have at least 36 marks or more with a 6 or above recommended for 'A' level or IBDP subjects. Pupils from countries with no public examinations at 16+ will be expected to submit their latest class grades:

For an English as an Additional Language candidate, their level of English should be certified by one of the following:

UKiset Test

- Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE) at A or B grade
- IGCSE ESOL at A or B grade
- Cambridge Advanced Certificate in English (CAE)
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System) at least level 5.5

Admissions Procedure

Before submitting an application, candidates may wish to attend one of our Information Afternoons held early in the Autumn Term. Registration forms should be completed and returned with a £250 application fee by the dates published each year. A full report from the candidate's current school, together with predicted GCSE grades where relevant should be provided. Upon registration, a Head's Reference will be sought from the current school.

From entry in September 2024 or September 2025, all A Level applicants for standard entry from will be expected to pass the GL Assessments CAT4 tests. Candidates can apply to attend an Assessment and Interview Day in November when they will undergo assessments and will be interviewed by the Head, an Admissions Tutor and other members of academic staff.

Academic Scholarship candidates will normally be tested in three of the subjects they intend to study in the Sixth Form, in addition to sitting a general English paper, a general Maths paper and an Abilities Test. Sport, Performing Art, Art and Music Scholarship



candidates will undergo specific assessments, in addition to sitting a CAT4 test (IB candidates would be expected to sit both papers) and an Abilities Test. All scholarship candidates will be interviewed by the Head, an Admissions Tutor and other members of staff.

Offers of a Place

Initial offers of places are made on 1st December. Suitable applicants who are not included in this first round of offers may, if they wish, be put onto a Waiting List. The number of places for entry into the Sixth Form is not fixed, but is dependent on various factors, and may vary considerably both from year to year and during the course of any one year.
